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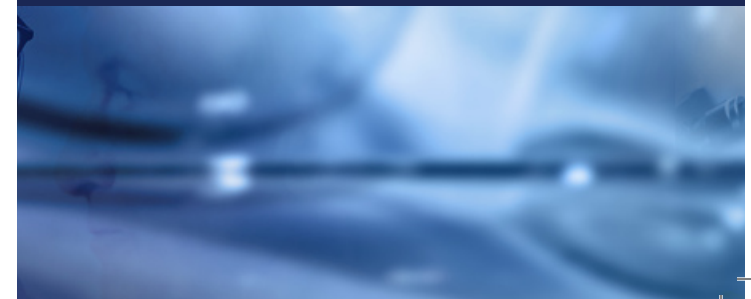

Essential Blood Tests to Add to Your Blood Chemistry Screens

I used to look at my patients' blood tests and wonder why they always came back normal, when I knew that they were by no means normal. NOW, by using the techniques I will teach you in this morning session, I can determine exactly what is going on with my patients' physiology and metabolism. Here is some of the information you will learn in this session:

- The elements that make the most sense to run to assess your patients' thyroid problems.
- 11 elements that have been identified as an independent risk factor for early detection of cardiovascular disease
- Which element is essential to measure in all patients with cancer
- The elements necessary to follow in all patients with diabetes and metabolic syndrome
- The elements you must follow in order to prevent the complications of diabetes in your diabetic patients
- Why following Hemoglobin A1C levels will help you significantly lower the risk of heart disease in your patients with Type 1 diabetes
- Which element, easily measure in the blood, has been shown to be associated with depression
- The element that is low in people with erectile dysfunction and high in people with adrenal dysfunction
- Why it is essential to measure PSA in all of your male patients over the age of 40... doing this will reduce the number of unnecessary biopsies
- Considerations before interpreting a thyroid panel... know how to cover your bases so you don't make common mistakes.
- Which elements are associated with increased risks for myocardial infarction, bone fracture, and poor cognitive function.

- How to differentiate the location of your patient's thyroid problem... Look at the bigger picture and get your patients' faster results.
- Which element is a sensitive measure of systemic inflammation... measure this element and keep on top of your patient's anti-inflammatory protocol
- Clinical indicators for anterior pituitary involvement in thyroid problems... Get fast results by identifying this under-diagnosed condition.
- Why measuring testosterone in your female patients may be even more important than measuring it in males
- Why measuring estradiol levels is essential in your elderly male patients
- The adrenal/thyroid relationship and why this must be addressed first... Not knowing this can lead to a frustrated doctor and unhappy patients.
- Which elements are associated with developing macular degeneration, gallstones, and low cognitive performance.
- A key nutrient that plays an essential role in thyroid metabolism (not iodine!) and how to assess for it... Don't let this common nutrient deficiency thwart you and your patients' efforts again
- Why annual blood testing is so essential, especially in your patients over the age of 40
- The full background of these elements and share the optimal reference ranges you must use to get the most information from these tests.
